To provide assistance to each other in the form of training and research facilities in the educational, professional, technical and administrative spheres.

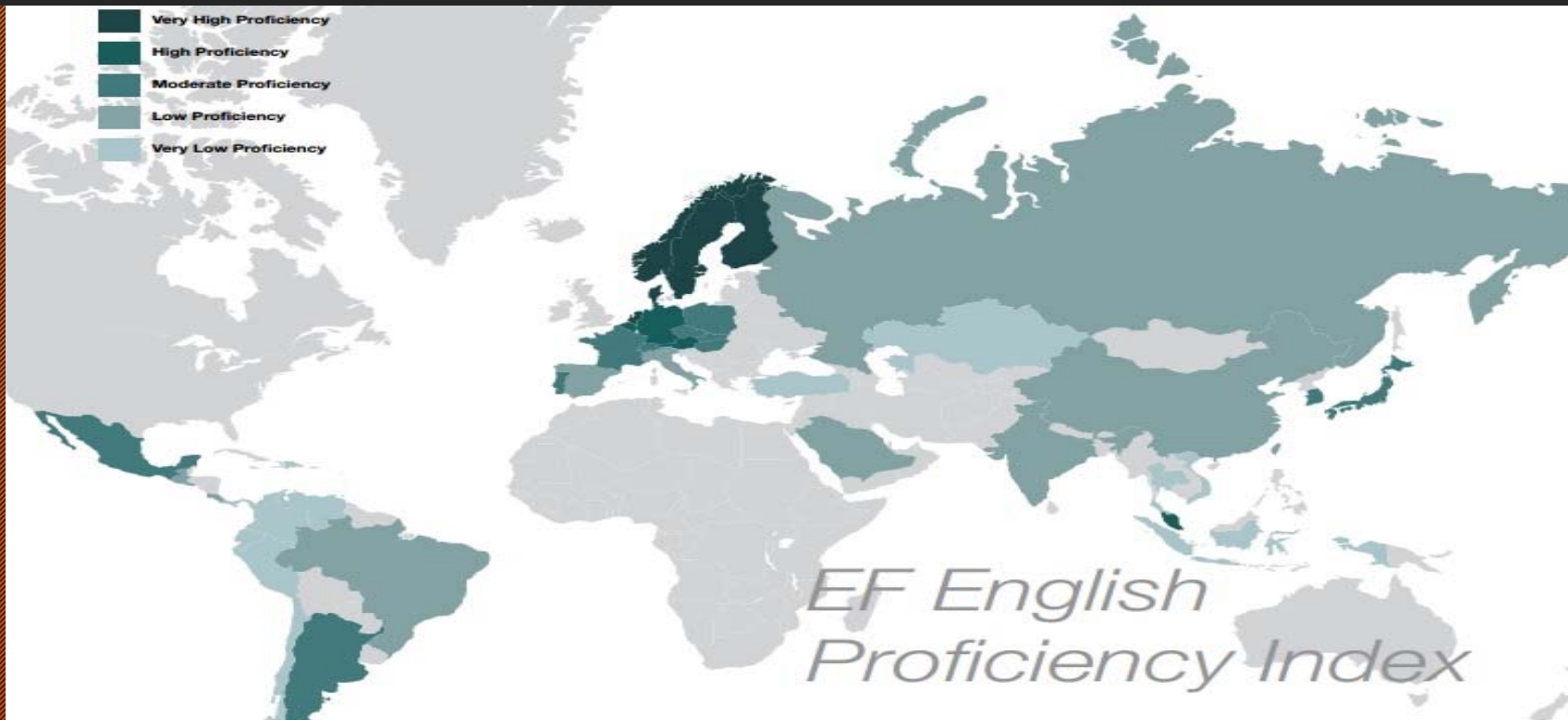


# ASEAN & ENGLISH LANGUAGE

- English was chosen as the official lingua franca of Asean in 2009.
- English is the language of choice in interactions between speakers of different first languages.
- its adaptation has proved particularly challenging for countries with no history of English language usage.
- Thailand has launched its own English language programmes aiming to teach conversational skills to some 14 million students.

# Features of ASEAN'S English

English is used as a medium by people who speak a local variety of English and those whose proficiency in English remains relatively low.

- English is now used as the medium of instruction for maths and science subjects in schools.
- AESEAN's English as a functional term rather than a linguistic one.
